Setting the scene before the journey

- PaN community: gathers the scientific analytical facilities such as Synchrotrons, Lasers, Free Electron Lasers and Neutron sources and their user communities
- Large user community (50 000 users) with heterogenous profiles:
 - Scientific field: Biology, Material science, chemistry ... Archaeology, nuclear physic, HEP
 - Academic and Industrial users
 - Quite often limited IT support in the users' home organisation
- Yearly data prod from 300TB to 10s of PB per RI, with datasets volumes from 10s of GB to 100s of TB
- Data are openly accessible after a 3 years embargo period
- Relatively small RIs' IT teams, mainly focused on data production (i.e. experiments, computing, FAIR data production and preservation) and scientific support (services for scientists and user support).
- 2 EOSC flagship community projects: PaNOSC and ExPaNDS

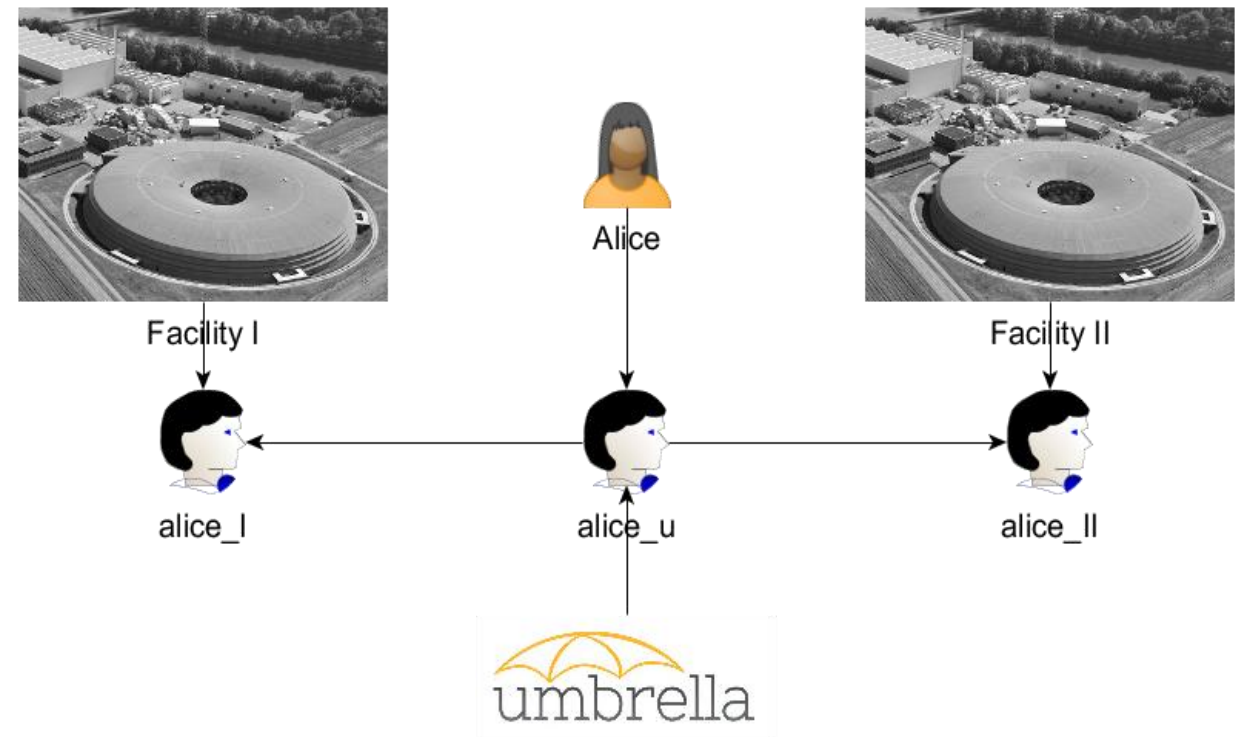


AAI - UmbrellaID



UmbrellaID is the AAI of the PaN community since 2012

- Provide a common Authentication and Authorisation Infrastructure that allows users of all PaN facilities to connect seamlessly to digital facility services with a **single, common and persistent unique ID**
- Authorisations remain fully under control of each facility providing the service
- Users are in full control of their personal data
- Technically: 1 logical IdP (infra: 2 IdPs with HA), metadata registry
- Protocols: SAML, Moonshot for non web access



2018: AAI a changing landscape



- Strong common will to join the effort for building EOSC
- What EOSC means in terms of AAI?
- Technology evolution (OIDC ...)
- New regulations (GDPR, ...), liability of the AAI?
- Security concerns raising up, are we sufficiently staff to offer a professional service?

UmbrellaID.org started out in 2012 as a collaboration between the main European academic user bodies in the field of research using electronic journals and resources (EJ-Access), the European Union Horizon 2020 project (H2020) and the main user community of the project (EJ-Access). The project is now a not-for-profit organization and is now a part of the umbrellaID project.

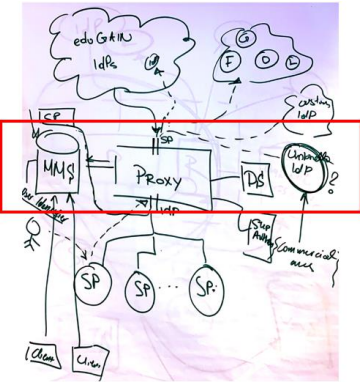
2. GOAL OF THIS DOCUMENT

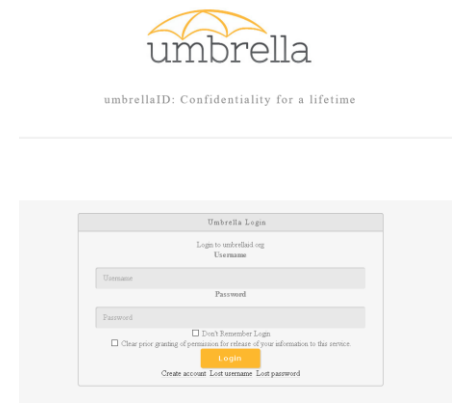

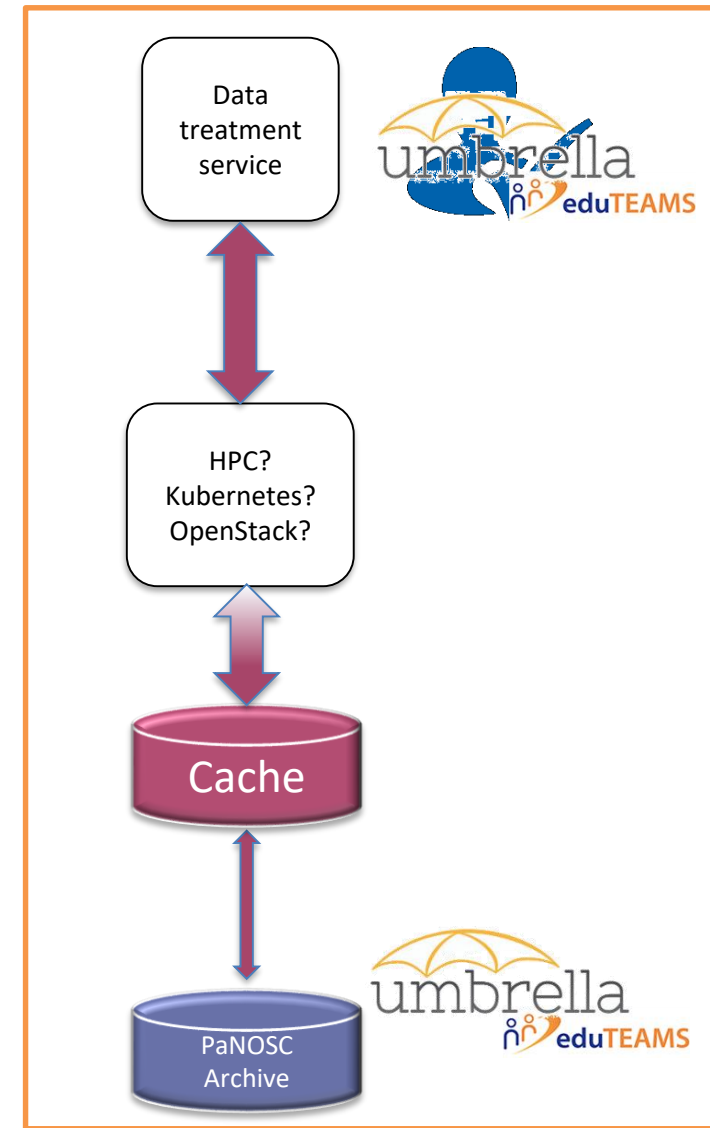
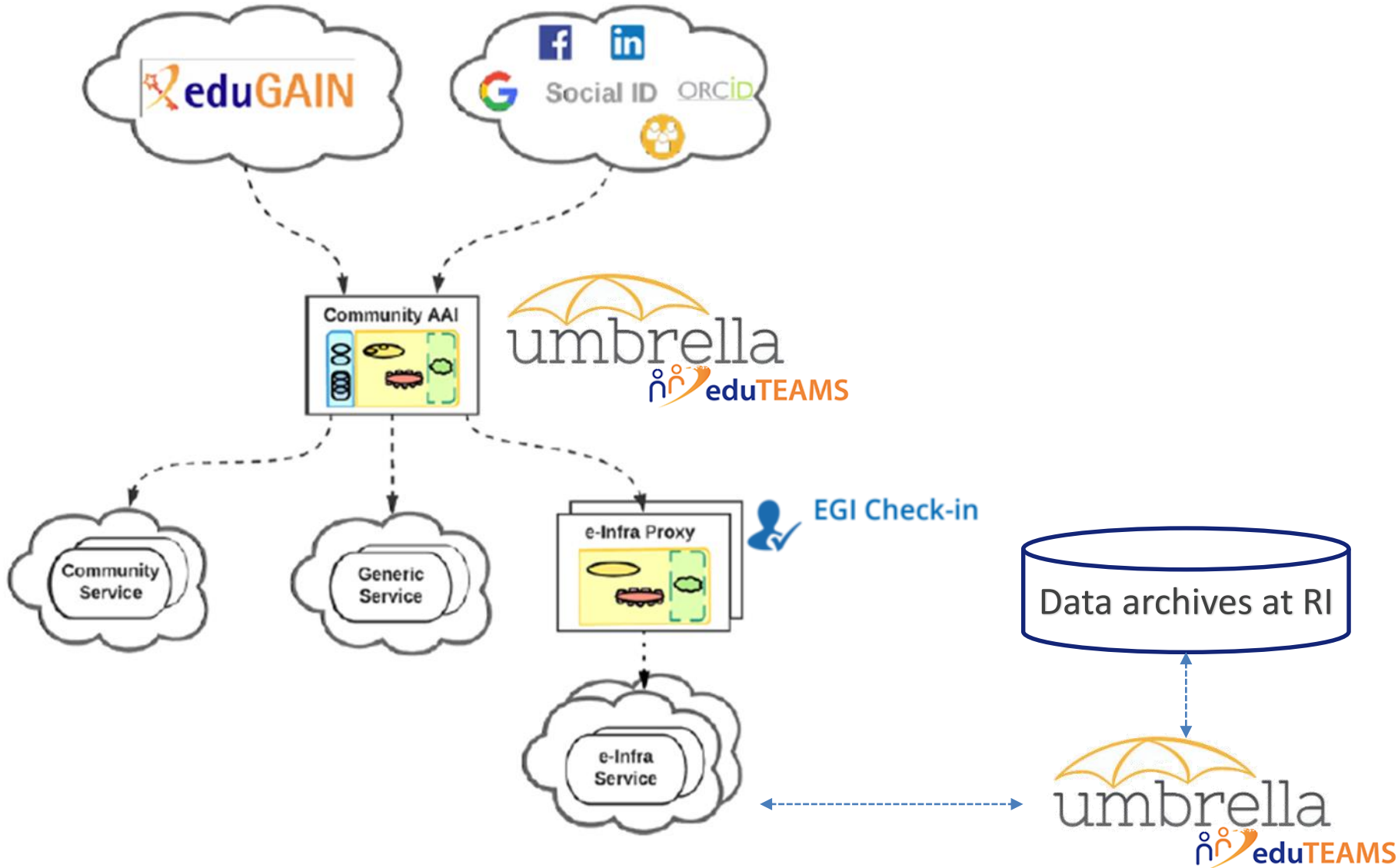
Where do we stand, 2 years later ?
